HEAD OF SAILING (MID-JUNE TO MID-AUGUST)

Create and supervise a structured instruction sailing program for beginner, intermediate and advanced participants. Help hire a sailing staff and ensure the supervision and safety of all sailors. Additional days/weeks for sailing school preparation, teaching and season end tasks may be available. Salary is commensurate with experience and certifications.
- Qualifications: Sail Canada certified at minimum CANSail level 3 & 4, higher levels of training and race experience are considered an asset. Pleasure craft operator card (PCOC). First aid CRC-EAD certificate. Boat safety certificate. NCCP Fundamental course. Ability to communicate in English and/or French. Minimum 3 years experience teaching sailing.

RACE & LEARN TO RACE COACH (LATE-JUNE TO EARLY-AUGUST)

- Description: The Race & Learn to Race Coach oversees the more advanced sailors as the progress in the world of competitive racing. A passion for racing and a constructive learning a must. Accompany sailors to 4-5 events in Quebec and Ontario and act a mentor for the kids and an ambassador for the club. Additional days/weeks for sailing school preparation, teaching and season end tasks may be available. Salary is commensurate with experience and certifications.
- Qualifications: Sail Canada certified at minimum CANSail instructor level 3 & 4 and race experience are a must. Pleasure craft operator card (PCOC). First aid CRC-EAD certificate. Boat safety certificate. NCCP Fundamental course. Ability to communicate in English and/or French. Minimum 2 years experience teaching sailing.



CANSAIL 1&2 INSTRUCTORS (MID-JUNE TO EARLY-AUGUST)

- Description: The CANSail 1 & 2 Instructors play a key role in introducing kids to sailing and giving them confidence to sail on their own. Core function is to organize and motivate the young sailors to discover the joy of sailing. A concern for safety a must. Additional days/weeks for sailing school preparation, teaching and season end tasks may be available. Salary is commensurate with experience and certifications.
- Qualifications: Sail Canada certified at minimum CANSail Instructor level 1 & 2 (or higher) required. Pleasure craft operator card (PCOC). First aid CRC-EAD certificate. Boat safety certificate. NCCP Fundamental course. Ability to communicate in English and/or French. Minimum 1 year experience teaching sailing.

WETFEET INSTRUCTOR (MID-JUNE TO EARLY-AUGUST)

- Description: The WetFeet Instructor works with our youngest sailors (5-6 yrs) to discover the basics of boat handling and water fun/safety. Fun and creativity are the name of the game. A concern for safety a must. Salary is commensurate with experience and certifications.
- Qualifications: Sailing activity certificate (or higher) required. First aid CRC-EAD certificate. Boat safety certificate. Ability to communicate in English and/or French. Minimum of 1 year experience working with kids.

DAYCAMP SAILING COUNSELLOR (MID-JUNE TO EARLY-AUGUST)

- Description: The DayCamp Sailing Counsellor accompanies the daycamp kids in their discovery of basic sailing and fun on the water. Managing small groups and encouraging kids to want to learn more about sailing are essential skills. A concern for safety a must. Salary is commensurate with experience and certifications.
- Qualifications: Sailing activity certificate (or higher) required. First aid CRC-EAD certificate. Boat safety certificate. Ability to communicate in English and/or French. Minimum of 1 year experience working with kids.
